



REALIZING THE DREAM

Resorts World New York City's new expansion will realize a decade-long vision to create a global gaming, entertainment and dining destination in the borough of Queens. The \$5 billion project will create 10,000 jobs beginning as soon as this year, and deliver billions of dollars in new revenue for New York State.

Spurring New York State's Economy

- The new Resorts World New York City will increase its permanent workforce by five-fold for a total of 5,000 employees. More than half of those jobs would come online within six months of full casino operations.
- Development would create an estimated 5,000 union construction jobs.
- New York State will immediately receive \$500 million from the gaming license fee, as well as millions of dollars in new, direct annual revenue.
- Resorts World will add an additional 2 million square feet of entertainment, gaming, retail, dining, and convention space to its existing 1-million-square-foot footprint.
- The proposed 350,000-square-foot casino floor will be one of the largest in the world, staffed by a diverse, local workforce.
- Resorts World will add 1,600 new hotel rooms, adding to the 400 already online at the Hyatt Regency.
- Guests will be able to enjoy approximately 30 new food and beverage options; take in the hottest DJ performances at the Ayu DayClub; and relax at the Awana Spa

Answering Community Needs

- The project would create 350,000 square feet of meeting, conference, and entertainment space, including a 7,000-seat arena.
- Resorts World will create more than 10 acres of publicly accessible greenspace – including pocket parks, new trails, and bike and running paths.
- A \$50 million investment in the Genting Innovation Center will lay the foundation for the Kenny "The Jet" Smith Academy; a Community Health and Wellness Center; and a Queens STEAM Institute.

A Vision for Aqueduct Park

- Future consolidation of horse racing at Belmont Park would open the remainder of the site to create Aqueduct Park – an expanded vision of the Resorts World proposal.
- This plan would invest an additional \$5 billion into the area to fully realize this vision.
- Aqueduct Park would add another 50 acres of new, dedicated parks.
- Approximately 3,000 units of union-built and labor-financed workforce housing would also be created.
- The proposal would also make new investments to improve mass transit connectivity both to Manhattan and JFK Airport.
