

Realizing the Dream

Resorts World New York City's \$5.5 billion vision will create 10,000 union construction and permanent jobs, as it creates a world-class integrated resort in Southeast Queens.

A World-Class Integrated Resort for New York City

- Resorts World New York City's vision reflects a 15-year partnership with New York State and the local community to build a destination in Queens.
- At 5.6 million square feet, RWNYC will become the largest integrated resort in the United States.
- Upon completion, the fully integrated resort will boast 800 table games and 6,000 slots and electronic table games (ETGs). Two-hundred and fifty tables and 4,000 slots/ETGs would become operational within six months of receiving a commercial gaming license.
- The integrated resort will create a total 2,000 hotel rooms, including the 400 existing at the Hyatt that opened in 2021; a 7,000-seat entertainment venue; more than 30 new food and beverage options; and alluring hospitality amenities.

Spurring New York State's Economy

- RWNYC will increase its permanent workforce to a total of 5,000 permanent employees. More than half of those jobs are expected to go to Queens residents and come online within six months of receiving a commercial casino license.
- Development would create an estimated 5,000 union construction jobs.
- New York State will immediately receive \$500 million from the gaming license fee earmarked for MTA operational costs. Within five years of receiving a license, RWNYC fees and revenue are expected to provide more than \$1 billion to improve the mass transit system.
- New York State will begin to feel the impact of new revenue as soon as July 2026, just six months after receiving a license, thanks to its unparalleled speed-to-market capabilities

Answering Community Needs

- The project would create 350,000 square feet of meeting, conference, and entertainment space, answering one of the greatest community needs.
- Resorts World will create more than 10 acres of publicly accessible greenspace including pocket parks, new trails, and bike and running paths.
- The Resorts World Innovation Center will lay the foundation for the Kenny "The Jet"
 Smith Academy; a Community Health and Wellness Center; and a Queens STEAM Institute.

Investing in Our Community

- Resorts World New York City has invested more than \$1.1 billion into Southeast Queens since opening its doors in 2011.
- Resorts World has generated more than \$4.5 billion for the state's public education fund.
- Resorts World is the largest single-employer of Hotel and Gaming Trades Council members in the State of New York, with 1,000 permanent employees in New York City alone.
- Approximately 80% of the existing workforce is comprised of people of color and nearly 50% female.

A Global Destination in the World's Borough

- Resorts World New York City welcomes an average of more than 5 million guests every year.
- Visitors have their choice to play at approximately 5,500 slot machines and electronic table games.
- Dining options include the highly touted RW Prime, Good Friends Noodle House, Brooklyn Dumpling House and the one-of-its-kind Rockaway Pizza.

Serving Our Neighbors

- Resorts World New York City responsibly kept members of the building trades employed during the pandemic, as it delivered the first four-star hotel to Southeast Queens in generations.
- The facility has served its neighbors in good times and bad, from a staging area during Hurricane Sandy to one of the state's largest testing and vaccine sites during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- RWNYC has invested \$50 million back into the community through support of local organizations, charitable efforts, sponsorships, and innovating programs. RWNYC has also invested in infrastructure at the Aqueduct site as well as Jamaica Station.
